





# // The Facts.

**01.** Asylum seekers are not allowed to claim mainstream welfare benefits. If they are destitute, a single adult is entitled to just £37.77 a week. This is less than 70% of regular income support. So asylum seekers are forced to live 30% below the poverty line.

Asylum applicants are not allowed to work. This means that even though many of them bring valuable skills and qualifications with them, they simply must rely on government support if destitute.

**02.** In 2001, 31% of asylum decisions were granted either refugee status or exceptional leave to remain. What's more, the Refugee Council estimates that, taking into account applicants who were successful at different appeals and where the Home Office overturned its own initial refusal decision, the total number of successful applicants in 2001 was as high as 51%.

Afghanistan, Iraq, Somalia, Sri Lanka and Turkey accounted for nearly half of UK asylum applications in 2001. Serious human rights abuses occur in all of them, including torture - even the British tabloids can't deny that.

**03.** As Europe tightens immigration controls, it is now virtually impossible for someone fleeing persecution to reach safety in the UK legally. Those asylum seekers who enter Britain illegally may have had no other option.

Britain has signed the 1951 UN Convention on Refugees, which means that anyone has the legal right to come here and claim asylum. Once a person has claimed asylum, they have a legal right to remain in the UK whilst their claim is being assessed.

**04.** A report by the Association of Chief Police Officers recently confirmed that there is no evidence for a higher rate of criminality among asylum seekers and refugees. In fact, they are more often the victims of crime.

There have been countless attacks on dispersed asylum seekers around Britain, including murders. These incidents prompted the UN High Commissioner for Refugees to condemn the British media for provoking racial hatred.

**05.** Refugees bring a wealth of skills and experience to this country and their contribution to the British economy, society and culture is immense. If we made more effort to integrate refugees, their contribution would be even greater. Thousands of qualified refugee doctors and nurses have skills that are going to waste while the NHS is desperate for staff.

Home Office research shows that migrants, including asylum seekers and refugees, made a net fiscal contribution of approximately £2.5 billion in 1999-2000.

**06.** Put in proportion, the figures tell a different story. Just 71,700 asylum applications were made in the UK last year – an 11% fall compared to 2000. Far from being the top destination, the UK ranked 12th in the EU in terms of asylum applications in relation to the overall population in 2001.

The vast majority of refugees flee to countries bordering their home country. Nearly two thirds of all refugees are found in the Middle East and in Africa. The Middle East hosts more than 6 million refugees, and there are more than 3.3 million refugees in Africa. The world's poorest countries bear the responsibility for the largest numbers of refugees.

**07.** If someone travels to the UK through what we assume to be a safe country, this does not mean that their asylum claim is not genuine.

Supposedly 'safe' European democracies may not be as safe as for asylum applicants as we think. Different countries have different interpretations of who should be given refugee status. For example, France has a record of returning many Algerians to face further abuses at home and Germany has returned Tamils to danger in Sri Lanka. The EU is now in the process of harmonising asylum policies, which may eventually lead to a common interpretation of the 1951 Convention on Refugees.

**08.** There are clear reasons why the Home Office may not be able to remove someone. The person may be ill, pregnant or the country of origin might not accept the person back because of lack of documentation.

Asylum seekers are NOT cheats because they have been unsuccessful with their asylum application – after all, they have exercised a fundamental human right.
